Supplies:

- Stamps: Words of Cheer #156357
- Ink: Blackberry Bliss #147092; Blackberry Bliss Blends #154877
- Paper: Blackberry Bliss #133675; Gold Shimmer Vellum #156471
- Designer Paper: Blackberry Beauty #156458
- Tools & Accessories: Gold Shimmer Ribbon #152156; Gold Holly Leaves #156311; Stitched So Sweetly Dies #151690; Simply Elegant Trim #155766; Gilded Gems #152478

Measurements:

- Card Base: Blackberry Bliss 8-1/2 x 5-1/2" scored at 4-1/4"
- Cardstock #2: Very Vanilla 4 x 5-1/4" plus scrap for sentiment
- Cardstock #3: Gold Shimmer Vellum scrap for die cut
- Designer Series Paper: 4 x 5-1/4"

Instructions:

- Lay card base flat and measure/mark at 2-3/4" along the bottom edge with a pencil. Then measure/mark at 2-1/4" from bottom upward on each side with a pencil.
- Score from the bottom center point upward to the two marked points in both left and right directions (see photo 2).
- Turn the card over. Fold the two longest score lines inward and then the two shorter score lines outward. Secure the flaps down with strong adhesive (see photo 3).

- Attach Very Vanilla layer to the inside of the card.
- Measure/mark at 2-5/8" along the bottom edge of the DSP then cut upward from that center point up the top left and top right points to form three triangles (see photo 4).
- Attach center triangle to the front triangle of the card. Attach two smaller triangles to the inside of the card over the Very Vanilla layer (see photo 3).
- Die cut a shape from the Gold Shimmer Vellum and attach to card front.
- Cut a few inches of ribbon and secure horizontally on top of the vellum.
- Cut about 8" of gold trim and secure in a circular pattern on top of the ribbon.
- Stamp sentiment in Blackberry Bliss ink and hand cut it out. Attach to the card using dimensionals.
- Apply some color to the gold holly leaves with the Blackberry Bliss Blends marker. Attach the leaves with glue dots.
